SB 187 Wake Boarding and Wake Surfing

The bill passed the Senate and is now in the House Committee on Natural Resources.

Places restrictions that apply to wake boarding or wake surfing on a small public freshwater lake that is at least 70 acres but not more than 300 acres

SB 187 would prohibit wake boarding or wake surfing between sunset and sunrise, and it would allow lake-front property owners to petition the Natural Resource Commission for further limits on their lake.

Lake Maxinkuckee is over 1,800 acres so if this passes, would not have much impact on our lake unless lakefront property owners petition for further limits.

Environmental groups are supporting this bill because wake boats create large wakes even at slower speeds. If they are close to shore, the large wake can cause shore erosion and damage piers. In shallow water, the wake can churn up bottom sediments which encourages overgrowth of algae and harms aquatic fish and plants.

Kline Levee Update

During the construction of the 2020 Kline
Levee Reconstruction Project, we were
faced with a section that settled differently
from the rest of the levee. The solution was
to let it settle for a year, then come back
with additional soil to make everything level.

LMEF secured a LARE grant to pay 80% of the cost for this additional work. Construction began last month. The soil will eventually be graded and the entire area reseeded.

Another way LMEF is being proactive in protecting Lake Maxinkuckee.
