The remnants of Hurricane Beryl dumped 6" of rain on the Lake Maxinkuckee watershed. That's over 1.4 BILLION gallons and equivalent to 10% of all the water in the lake!

The Academy parade grounds was turned into a temporary pond, streams overflowed their banks, and erosion cut new paths. It was a reminder of the power and importance of water, and of the need to keep stormwater and drinking water concerns at the forefront of our decision making.
